


# ELK & POTTER COUNTIES, PENNSYLVANIA



## THE PROBLEM: AGING HOUSING STOCK

Over **one in ten homes** in Elk and Potter Counties were built **over 85 years ago**.



- **\$268,276** was awarded through the WHR Program to Elk County and **\$200,000** was awarded to Potter County.

- **\$465,842** spent on home repairs, including structural replacements and water management system repairs.

- **\$10,000** spent on workforce development and training.

- **13 projects** completed in Elk and Potter Counties using Whole-Home Repairs funding.



## THE SOLUTION: HOME REPAIR PROGRAMS

Whole-Home Repairs (WHR) Program funding is helping Elk and Potter Counties address longstanding housing challenges by supporting critical home repairs, expanding workforce training, and beginning to reduce a growing waitlist of residents in need.

Training programs offered through local institutions are helping to prepare workers to meet the region's increasing demand for home upgrades and essential repairs.

**Kane, Lantz, Ludlow and De Young** in Elk and **Codersport, Sweden Valley and Raymond** in Potter have the largest share of the oldest homes.
