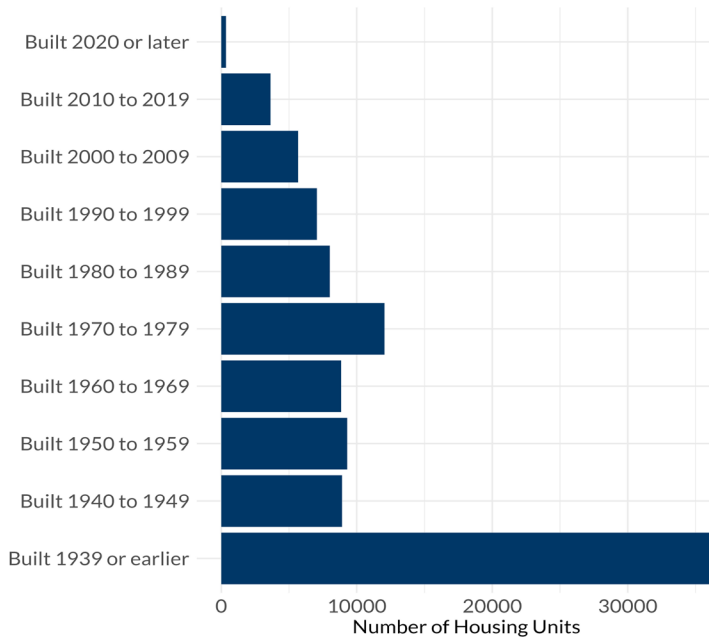


LACKAWANNA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA



THE PROBLEM: AGING HOUSING STOCK

More than **one in three homes** in Lackawanna County were built **over 85 years ago**.



- **\$2,128,437** awarded to Lackawanna County through the Whole-Home Repairs Program.

- **95** projects committed/ completed using Whole-Home Repairs Program funds so far.

- Projects include a wide range of **essential home repairs addressing health, safety, and habitability**—such as **roofing, heating systems, plumbing, structural issues, and more**.

All information is current as of May 2025. The data reflects a snapshot of the program's impact and does not capture its full scope, as funding is still being distributed and used.

THE SOLUTION: HOME REPAIR PROGRAMS

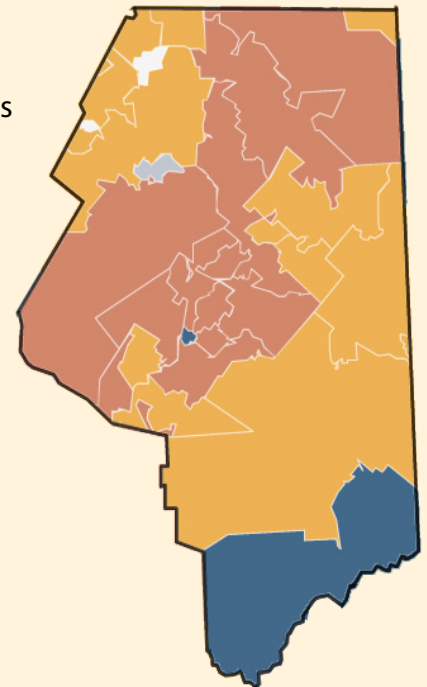
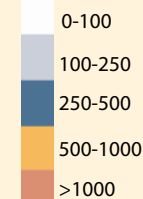
The Whole-Home Repairs Program is helping Lackawanna County address critical housing needs by funding a broad scope of essential home repairs.

Projects have included roof repairs, heating and hot water system replacements, window and siding replacements, deck repairs, electrical upgrades, door replacements, plumbing and floor repairs, foundation work, and vermiculite insulation removal.

By supporting these vital improvements, the program is helping to ensure that residents can remain safely and comfortably in their homes, while also preserving the long-term integrity of the county's housing stock.

Scranton and Taylor have the largest share of the oldest homes in the county.
