

THE PROBLEM: AGING HOUSING STOCK

More than **one in four homes** in Lawrence County were built **over 85 years ago**.



- **\$934,099** awarded to Lawrence County through the Whole-Home Repairs Program.

- **12** projects scheduled to be completed using Whole-Home Repair funds so far.

- **\$16,495** expended towards workforce development and training. so far


All information is current as of December 2024. The data reflects a snapshot of the program's impact and does not capture its full scope, as funding is still being distributed and used.

THE SOLUTION: HOME REPAIR PROGRAMS

Whole-Home Repairs Program funding is helping Lawrence County address longstanding housing challenges by supporting critical home repairs, expanding workforce training, and beginning to reduce a growing waitlist of residents in need.

Training programs offered through local institutions are helping to prepare workers to meet the region's increasing demand for home upgrades and essential repairs.

New Castle, Oakwood, Altman, Energy, PA, Oakland, Rose Point and McCaslin have the largest share of the oldest homes in the county.
